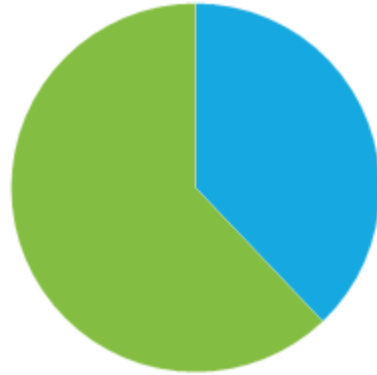

## School Context and Organization Strengths

ELA has embedded greater emphasis on instructional time with the expectation of having bell to bell instruction and intervention embedded into the master schedule for each grade level. Instructional support is also made readily available by our instructional support team, consisting of: interventionists, literacy coach and data fellow. ELA has implemented efforts to support and reinforce the importance of planning and team building. Time has been allotted in the instructional schedule to increase time for planning (60 min/daily vs 45 min/daily) as well as time to build collegial relationships via an extended lunch period (45 min/daily vs 30 min/daily). Representatives from each grade level/department and family/community are invited to partake in the decision-making process as evidenced by committee membership, agendas, sign-in sheets, etc.
